JAIME AKER, LMSW

Jaime Aker is a Licensed Social Worker who has experience working with children and families and coordinating non-profit programs since 2014. Jaime currently manages the Children, Teens and Families Program at Gilda's Club Westchester and is a member of AOSW, the Association of Oncology Social Work. She is also an adjunct instructor at Montclair State University. Jaime holds a BA and a post-graduate certificate in Child Advocacy and Policy from Montclair State University, and an MSW degree from Rutgers University.

CHRISTINE SPECK, LCSW

Chris Speck is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker who has been working with critically ill individuals and their families since 2011. She joined Gilda's Club in 2016 and currently oversees Gilda's Club Westchester's Program Department. She completed her Masters in Social Work with honors at New York University and was selected as a Zelda Foster Fellow which provided additional training and mentorship in palliative and end-of-life care. Chris also completed a Post Masters Certificate in Palliative and End of Life training at NYU.

Pam Davis, the Founder of Wellbotics, is an accomplished educator with a balance of education and experience in instructional media and technology. She holds a doctorate degree from Columbia University in Instructional Media and Technology with professional expertise that spans the fields of computer literacy and integrating technology into existing practice.
